

Rules for Hunting at John E. Williams Preserve

Contact Information:

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1. This preserve is open to hunting of all game species allowed by law.
2. All local, state, and federal laws applying to the hunting activity must be observed, including obtaining all required government licenses or permits.
3. Unnecessary shooting or shooting at targets is prohibited.
4. Alcoholic beverages are prohibited on the Property.
5. Camping, smoking, and fires are prohibited on the Property.
6. There shall be no cutting, breaking, or clearing of vegetation.
7. Permanent tree stands and blinds are not allowed. Temporary tree stands and blinds are permitted but must be removed prior to expiration of this permit. Any stands or blinds not removed by this date shall become the property of the Conservancy. Please place your name/contact information on your stands.
8. Access to the Property must be along the existing roads. No off-road vehicle use is allowed. Use of horses is not allowed.
9. Leave all gates as you find them.
10. Avoid hunting where cattle are present.
11. Baiting is not permitted.
12. Not trapping or snaring is allowed.
13. There shall be no dumping of ashes, trash, garbage, chemical waste or other unsightly or offensive material on the Property.
14. Liability Waiver: By hunting on The Nature Conservancy lands you acknowledge that hunting is inherently dangerous and that you are aware of the risks and dangers involved. By engaging in hunting as an activity, you assume all responsibility for any injury to persons or damages to property that occur in connection with your use of the Conservancy's property. As a hunter, for yourself, your heirs, successors and assigns, you hereby agree to release, indemnify, and hold the Conservancy harmless from any and all claims, liabilities, losses, damages, costs and expenses incurred in connection with your and any accompanying minor child's activities or presence on the Conservancy's property, whether or not due to any negligent acts or omissions of the Conservancy.
